Bronson by colliding with a vehicle in which Diane K. Bronson was an occupant when operating a motor vehicle with criminal negligence in that the defendant failed to maintain the proper lane of traffic, and Diane K. Bronson was not a passenger in the vehicle operated by the defendant.

I have probable cause to believe that on 07-04-2011, at E. Blue Parkway and Interstate 435 in

committed one or more criminal offense(s). **Murder x2, DUI, Careless Driving**

The facts supporting this belief are as follows:

On 07-04-2011, at 0820 hours, Kansas City, Missouri Police Dispatchers received 3 calls in regard to a white SUV driving eastbound in the westbound lanes of Interstate 70 from Paseo, Prospect Ave., and Harrison Ave. At 0821 hours Police Dispatchers received a call in regard to a white vehicle driving eastbound in the westbound lanes of traffic on Interstate 70 at Truman Rd. At 0828 hours Police Dispatches received 2 calls in regard to a white Blazer/white sedan to be driving southbound in the northbound lanes of Interstate 435 from Interstate 70 and E. 63<sup>rd</sup> St. At 0830 hours Police Dispatchers received a call in regard to a white Ford Explorer driving southbound in the northbound lanes of traffic on Interstate 435 from Blue Parkway at which time Kansas City, Missouri Police Officers were dispatched to the area of E. 63<sup>rd</sup> St. and Interstate 435, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri in an attempt to locate the white SUV. At 0832 hours Police Dispatchers received 3 calls in regard to an injury accident involving a white SUV and a black vehicle. At 0833 hours the officers were informed by Police Dispatchers that there was now an injury accident at Blue Parkway and Interstate 435 northbound involving a white Ford Explorer and a Black vehicle.

Upon arrival officers observed the driver of a white Mercury Mountaineer, bearing Missouri license plate 6UK191, still remaining in the vehicle's driver seat. The defendant, later identified as **Luis Solano-Barrera, H/M, 01-20-1988**, was extricated from the driver seat of the white Mercury by members of the Kansas City, Missouri Fire Department and transported to an area hospital for treatment for non-life threatening injuries. The defendant had in his possession two Estados Unidos Mexicanos identification cards bearing the name Luis Solano Barrera, DOB 01-20-1988. However, each identification card had a different photo. The defendant claimed his name to be Felix Solano-Gallardo, H/M, 12-11-1992. Attempts to confirm the defendant's identity were only successful after Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents conducted an interview with him. A residence check of the address to which the Mercury is registered to, revealed no one at the residence knew of the defendant by either name or were familiar with a vehicle matching the description of the Mercury.


The two victims, **Diane K. Bronson, W/F, 04-28-1967** and a **female juvenile, A.B.**, were the occupants of the black Chevrolet Impala, bearing Missouri license plate YC0P5P. Both victims were pronounced dead at the scene.

A DUI Officer contacted the defendant at the hospital and read Missouri Implied Consent to him through a Spanish Interpreter. The DUI Officer noted the defendant would not respond and appeared to be unresponsive. The DUI Officer obtained two vials of blood from the defendant, drawn by a nurse employed by the hospital, at 1022 hours and two more vials of blood from the defendant, drawn by the same nurse, at 1123 hours. The DUI Officer obtained a fingerprint elimination card from the defendant, which he transported to the crime lab for comparison. The DUI Officer transported the samples of blood to Children's Mercy Hospital for processing, which revealed the defendant's BAC to be .185 at 1022 hours and .140 at 1123 hours.

While speaking with the defendant in an effort to confirm his identity he was evasive and stated he did not know his address or his date of birth. The defendant finally provided the date of birth 12-11-1992 and when asked where he lived, in Spanish, he responded, "mi casa." When asked again what his address was the defendant gave the address of 34<sup>th</sup> and Minnesota in Kansas City, Kansas. A Traffic Investigation Detective and a Spanish speaking Detective read the defendant the Miranda Waiver form 340A P.D. at 1207 hours. After reading the Miranda Waiver form 340A P.D. several times the defendant invoked his right to an attorney at 1210 hours.
