# I wish to meet Captain America.



Bécquer, age 3  
Retinoblastoma

Wish Child, Bécquer, is excited to see Captain America and all the other superheroes "Save the Day!"



Bécquer was diagnosed with Retinoblastoma, a rare form of cancer that attacks the retinas of the eyes. It most often affects young children and rarely adults. The malignant tumor can develop in one or both eyes. Only his left eye was affected. This makes Bécquer the third generation to have dealt with Retinoblastoma. His maternal grandfather and his mother both developed the tumor in their left eye and needed to have that eye removed to prevent the cancer from spreading.

Bécquer is very confident and strong-willed. He knows what he wants and he takes part in that voting process. This mindset requires his parents to lose more battles than they would like in terms of him wearing his Air Jordan or KU Jayhawk sweat-suits and his Superman light-up shoes as much as possible. His favorite songs are "Hit the Road Jack" (Ray Charles), "Baby Beluga" (Raffi), and the entire Drum Safari children's cd (Brandon & Teryn Draper). He loves books, reading, and library visits, enjoys playing games plus educational applications on his parents phones, and without prompting from his parents, he fell in love with superheroes.

Bécquer was born with the gene, so his parents were always aware that retinoblastoma could be a part of his life and he received regular evaluations under anesthesia to verify that both eyes remained tumor-free. He was diagnosed at eighteen months of age during one of his visits and we immediately sought treatment from Wills Eye Center in Philadelphia. The medical team led by Dr. Carol Shields performed a plaque radiation therapy that consisted of sewing the plaque into the outside of the eyeball and keeping it on for a period of seven days. While in place the plaque delivers a high dose of radiation to the affected area. He then required daily eye drops and medication.

Upon the diagnosis, his mom was devastated and blamed herself for his predicament. "Though extremely saddened and concerned for his health and future, Bécquer would be an exceptional, happy, successful, and loved individual," said his parents.

Currently Bécquer's cancer is in remission and his vision has been unaffected; a true blessing! His parents are still keeping up with the MRI's and follow up visits to Wills Eye and Dr. Leahey at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, along with other evaluations of his eyes to ensure he remains a healthy, joyful, perfect child.
